Notes from PFM:

This fruit parfait and lasagna may be listed as several items on your at-market menu to highlight the choices available to the shopper. However, it is acceptable to combine offerings that utilize a similar base ingredient.

Granola from PFM vendor does not count toward our minimum sourcing requirements because the ingredient is not a raw agricultural ingredient.

Sausage from Scratch Meats also does not count toward our minimum sourcing requirement because the business is not a farm.

Additionally, the watermelon sourced from CoOp and the milk sourced from Organic Valley is not considered locally sourced regardless of where CoOp or Organic Valley is sourced from the original raw ingredients.
